CONTROLLING BROWN-BANDED COCKROACHES IN VEHICLES

What Do Brown-Banded Cockroaches Look Like?

Brown-banded cockroach (*Supella longipalpa*) is a common pest found in vehicles in Singapore. The name "brown-banded" comes from the pronounced transverse bands across their bodies. The pronotum (chest) has a dark brown area shaped like a bell. This cockroach is similar to the German cockroach in size, measuring about 12 mm in length.

Biology

During her lifetime, female brown-banded cockroach produces about 14 egg capsules, each contains 14 to 18 eggs. The female carries the egg capsule for up to 48 hours before hatching. Males are capable fliers due to their fully developed wings, while females have shorter, underdeveloped wings and cannot fly.

What Do Brown-banded Cockroaches Eat?

The brown-banded cockroach will feed on almost anything. In vehicles, they may feed on food crumbs, packaging materials, and glue. They are attracted to starchy materials like book bindings.

Are Brown-banded Cockroaches Dangerous?

Yes. Brown-banded cockroaches can pose health risks. They are known to carry microorganisms and contaminate surfaces with pathogens. Recent medical studies have shown that cockroach-produced allergens can trigger asthma attacks, especially in children and sensitive individuals.

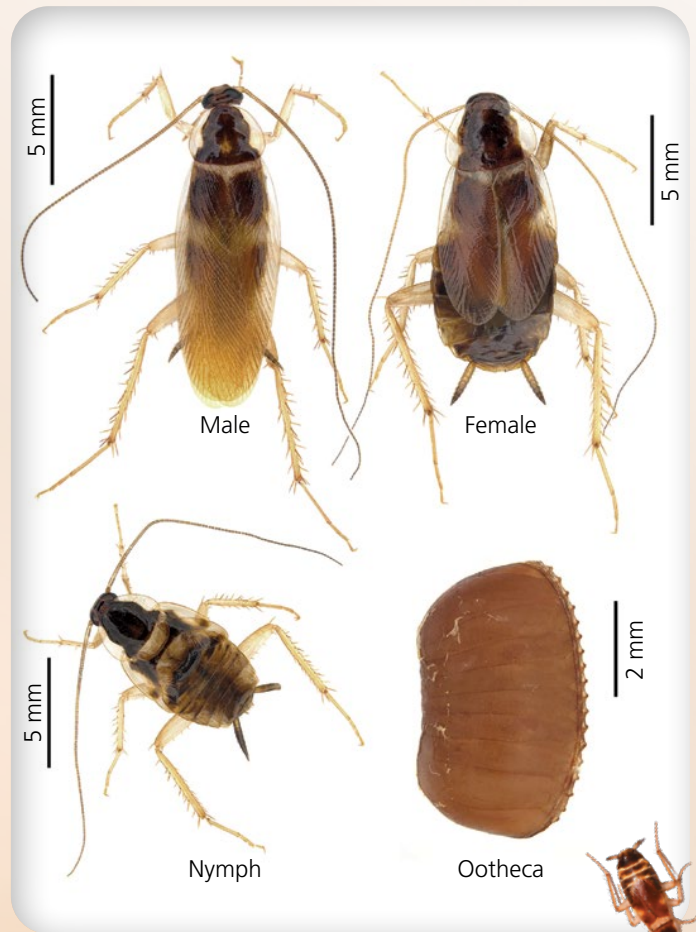

How to Get Rid of Brown-Banded Cockroaches?

Established infestations can be challenging to control, as these cockroaches tend to spread throughout hidden areas such as vehicle interiors, seams, dashboards, and compartments.

If there is evidence of a brown-banded cockroach infestation, contact a licensed pest professional for a thorough inspection and treatment.

Aardwolf's CO₂ fumigation technology, adapted from Japan, uses a super-dry gas to eliminate brown-banded cockroaches and other pests within vehicle in less than 1 hour.
